Our Beliefs

An Overview Of What We Believe The Bible Teaches

The Bible

We believe that the Bible in its original writings - consisting of 66 books and divided by the Old and New Testament - is God's inspired (2 Ti 3:16; 2 Pe 1:20-21), inerrant (Jhn 17:17; 1 Th 2:13; 1 Co 2:13; Heb 6:18), and infallible (Jhn 17:17; Psa 19:7) Word for mankind. It has by God's providence been kept pure in all ages (Mat 24:35; Isa 40:8). It is the final authority for all matters of faith and practice (2 Ti 3:16).

We believe the Scriptures should be interpreted according to their normal, grammatical-historical meaning. We believe, whereas there may be several applications of any given passage of Scripture, there is but one true interpretation. The meaning of Scripture is to be found as one diligently applies the literal grammatical-historical method of interpretation under the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit (Jhn 7:17; 16:12-15; 1 Co 2:7-15). It is the responsibility of every believer to ascertain carefully the true intent and meaning of Scripture, recognizing that proper application is binding on all generations (Psa 100:5; 119:160; Jhn 17:17; 2 Ti 2:15).

God

We believe God is the Creator of all (Gen 1 & 2; Col 1:16; Jhn 1:3). He is a spirit (Jhn 4:24) and is three - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - yet one God (Gen 1:26; Deu 6:4; Mat 28:19; 2 Co 13:14). He - being three in one - is co-eternal in being, co-identical in nature, coequal in power and glory, and has the same attributes and perfections (Deu 6:4; Psa 90:2; Mat 28:19; Jhn 14:10, 26; 2 Co 13:14; 1 Pe 1:2). He is also equally holy, loving, and just (Deu 32:4; 1 Pe 1:16; 1 Jhn 4:8). There is no other god besides Him (Isa 45:4).

Jesus Christ

We believe Jesus Christ is the Son of God (Mar 1:1) - being one of the Trinity (Mat 28:19; Jhn 1; 2 Co 13:14). For the salvation of man, He became flesh while continuing to be God (Jhn 1:1, 3, 14, 18, 29; Phl 2:5-11; 1 Ti 3:16)- Being born of the virgin Mary and conceived by the Holy Ghost (Isa 7:14; Mat 1:25; Luk 1:26-35). He lived a sinless life, at the end of which He physically died and rose again as God's acceptable payment for sin (Rom 5:6-15; 2 Co 5:21). After His

death and resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven where He now sits at God's right hand being our Great High Priest (Rom. 8:34; Heb 7:25, 26; 9:24-28; 1 Jhn 2:1-2). We believe that He will one day return to earth again to rule and reign as King for 1,000 years before the Great White Throne Judgment (Act 1:9-11; Rev 20).

The Holy Spirit

We believe that the Holy Ghost is one of the Trinity - co-equal with the Father and Son of God (Mat 28:19; Act 5:3-4; 2 Co 13:14). Today He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ (Jhn 16:7-13). He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation (Jhn 14:16-17; 1 Co 2:12; 3:16). He is the Comforter and guides all men into all Truth (Jhn 16:7-13). We believe as Christians we are to live under His guidance daily (Gal 5:16, 18, 25; Eph 5:18).

We believe that the Holy Spirit administers spiritual gifts to believers. We believe he is sovereign in bestowing of all His gifts for the perfecting of the saints today (1 Co 12:4-11; Eph 4:7-12). We believe that speaking in tongues and the working of sign miracles in the beginning days of the church were for the purpose of pointing to and authenticating the apostles as revelers of divine truth, and were never intended to be characteristics of the lives of believers (1 Co 13:8-10; 2 Co 12:12; Her 2:1-4).

Creation

We believe that God created the universe in six literal, 24-hour periods (Gen 1-2; Exo 20:11). We reject evolution, the Gap Theory, the Day-Age Theory, and Theistic Evolution as unscriptural theories of origin.

Mankind

We believe God made mankind in His image and likeness (Gen 1:26-31). He first made man - Adam; and then woman - Eve (Gen 2:7-25). From these two people came the entire human race. Being created sinless but with a free will, mankind chose to disobey God - alienated themselves from Him (Gen 2, 3; Isa 59:1, 2). Adam's sin caused all mankind to inherit a sinful nature (Rom 5:12). Mankind is

totally depraved and, of themselves, utterly unable to remedy their lost condition (Isa 53:6; Rom 3:23; Eph 2:1-3).

Sin & Salvation

We believe that all human beings are born sinners due to the disobedience of our common ancestor, Adam (Psa 51:5; 58:3; Isa 53:6; Rom 5:12; Eph 2:3). We believe that the payment for sin is death (Rom 6:23). Jesus' physical death on the cross is the only acceptable payment for sin according to God (Jhn 14:6; 1 Co 15:1-4; 2 Co 5:21; Eph 2:8, 9; 1 Jhn 2:1, 2).

We believe that salvation is the gift of God brought to man by grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose precious blood was shed on Calvary for the forgiveness of our sins (Eph 1:7; 2:8-9; 1 Pe 1:18-19). Salvation is a gift from God, not a result of a person's good works or any human efforts (Eph 2:8-9; Gal 2:16; Tit 3:5). To be saved one must be born again (Jhn 1:12-13; 3:3). This new birth is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new creatures in Christ Jesus (Tit 2:11; 2 Co 5:17). It is a change of heart wrought by the Holy Spirit through conviction of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (Jhn 16:8; Act 3:19; Gal 2:16; Eph 2:8-9; Rom 10:8-11).

Eternal Security

We believe because God gives mankind eternal life at salvation and the Holy Spirit as our seal, those truly saved cannot lose their salvation (Jhn 3:16; Rom 6:23; 2 Co 1:22; 5:1-5; Eph 1:13, 14; 4:30). Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by any human effort (Eph 2:8, 9). God, being one who cannot lie, secures our salvation as He promises in His Word (Jhn 3:16; Jhn 10:29; Rom 10:9, 13; Tit 1:2).

The New Testament Church

We believe that New Testament Church began with the calling out of the twelve apostles by Jesus Christ and was empowered on the day of Pentecost (Mat 16:16-18; Act 1, 2). We believe the church is the body and bride of Christ, of which Christ is the head (1 Co 12:27; Eph 5:23; Col 1:18). We believe that the

church on earth is divided into localized congregations of people who have been saved, baptized, and voluntarily united together under Christ and His Word (Acts 2:41, 42; 9:31; 15:41; 16:5).

We believe the biblical offices of the church consist of pastors and deacons (1 Ti 3:1-15). These offices, as specified by the context of Scripture, are to be held by men who met the Scriptural qualifications of 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1. Accordingly, only naturally-born men are eligible for licensure and ordination by the church.

Baptism And The Lord's Supper

We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are the two ordinances of God given to saved persons and each local church. We believe the two ordinances have no part in salvation (Mat 28:19-20; Luk 23:39-43; 1 Co 11:23-28; Eph 2:8-9).

We believe baptism (immersion, submersion in water) is to be done after salvation as a picture and testimony of what God has done in a saved person's life (Act 2:41; 8:36-38; Rom 6:3-5).

The Lord's Supper is to be observed as a reminder of Jesus' death for our sins until He returns. We believe the use of bread and fruit of the vine is the only acceptable means of observing this ordinance. We believe only those saved should take part in this ordinance. Those saved should be careful not to take the Lord's Supper unworthily as the Scripture teaches (Mat 26:17-30; 1 Co 11:23-28).

End Times

We believe in the Pre-Tribulational Rapture of all believers, followed by a seven-year tribulation (Dan 9; 1 Co 15:51-58; 1 Th 4:13-18; 5:9; Rev 3:10). We believe in the Pre-Millennial Return of Christ to the earth and His literal rule of one-thousand-years (Rev 19-20). Following this one-thousand-year reign will be the Great White Throne Judgment and the establishment of the new heaven and new earth (Rev 20-22).

Eternity

We believe people were created by God to live forever (Gen 2). Due to mankind's disobedience, every human being will exist eternally separated from God by sin or eternally with God through the salvation of Jesus Christ (Jhn 3:16, 36; 5:28-29; Rom 6:23).

We believe the souls of those not saved remain, after death, in conscious punishment and torment until the second resurrection, when with soul and body reunited, they will appear at the Great White Throne Judgement, and will be cast into the literal Lake of Fire, not to be annihilated, but to suffer everlasting conscious punishment and torment. (Mat 25:41-46; Mar 9:43-48; Luk 16:19-26; 2 Th 1:7-9; Jde 6-7; Rev 20:11-15)

We believe the souls of those saved are, at death, absent from the body and present with the Lord, where in conscious bliss they await the first resurrection, when spirit, soul, and body are reunited to be glorified forever with the Lord and dwell with Him in His eternal setup (2 Co 5:8; PhI 1:23; 3:21; 1 Th 4:16-17; Rev 20:4-6).

Music

We believe that God has commanded each believer to worship Him through song (Psa 9:11, 47:6-7, 147:1; Eph 5:19). Regardless of the age of a song or its author, all music used for worship in the church should be doctrinally and scripturally sound in its lyrics. Such music should be sung in praise to God and should be done in the heart of true worship - in spirit and in truth (Jhn 4:24).

We believe God wants us to sing new songs in worship to Him as much as older songs (Psa 33:3, 40:3, 96:1; Eph 5:19; Col 3:16). We believe that the Bible approves the use of all forms of musical instruments to worship God through music (1 Ch 13:8; 1 Ki 1:40; Psa 33:2, 92:3, 98:6, 149:3, 150:5).
